CHAD is a Crime-Free Multi-Family Housing Program

Initiative is a win-win for the 29 communities where CHAD owns multi-family properties in DuPage, Kane and Cook counties



The Crime Free Multi-Housing Program is a state-of-the-art, crime prevention program designed to reduce crime, drugs, and gangs in apartment properties. This program was successfully developed at the Mesa Arizona Police Department in 1992.

The International Crime Free Multi-Housing
Program has spread to nearly 2,000 cities in 44
U.S. states, five Canadian Provinces, Mexico,
England, Finland, Japan, Russia, Malaysia,
Nigeria, Afghanistan, and Puerto Rico.

CHAD participates in the program by partnering with local police in the towns and villages where CHAD owns multifamily properties. Staff asks residents to sign a Crime-Free Housing Addendum when they move in. The result of this team effort is a safer, more habitable environment in which to live. For example, the initiative does not allow residents to prop open common doors. Loitering is also not tolerated on CHAD properties.

Vandalism to CHAD properties can result in costly repairs. Graffiti on brickwork is difficult to remove and is unsightly. Residents should call the police and the CHAD office immediately if they see or know of anyone vandalizing and endangering the safety of others. There are anonymous tip lines for reporting criminal activities.

Violating any of the provisions in the addendum is a serious violation and material non-compliance with the Residential Lease Agreement.



Follow these common-sense rules to make sure CHAD's multi-family properties are maintained to top standards all the time

Here Are Six "Yes!" Activities to Proper Garbage Disposal

- YES: Place trash contained in a tightly tied plastic bag before placing in the dumpster!
- YES: Keep the dumpster lid closed at all times!
- YES: Break down all boxes!
- YES: Show children how to safely use the dumpster and corral. Youth can become great role-models on how to keep common garbage areas neat and clean!
- YES: Keep the corral gate closed as a proactive way to deter animals!

And the "No's" Include...

- NO: Refrain from throwing loose garbage around the dumpster
- NO: Do not dispose of flammable, toxic or hazardous materials; furniture, mattresses, box springs, appliances, tires or automobile batteries



Bake these easy-to-make cookies into the shape of an ornament. Enjoy them as snacks or as colorful holiday decorations!

Yields: 50 Total Time: 40 min **Prep Time:** 25 min Oven Temp: 350

Ingredients

- 2- 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoons salt
- 1 cup or 2 sticks unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 3/4 cups sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1-1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

- In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, and salt.
- Using an electric mixer, beat the butter and sugar until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Beat in the egg and then the vanilla.
- Reduce the mixer speed to low and gradually add the flour mixture, mixing just until incorporated. Shape the dough into 4 disks and roll each between 2 sheets of wax paper to 1/8 inch thick. Chill until firm, 30 minutes in the refrigerator or 15 minutes in the freezer.
- Heat oven to 350 degrees F. Line baking sheets with parchment paper. Using floured cookie cutters, cut out cookies. Place on the prepared sheets. Reroll, chill, and cut the scraps.
- Bake, rotating the positions of the pans halfway through, until the cookies are lightly golden brown around the edges, 10 to 12 minutes. Let cool on the sheets for 5 minutes before transferring to wire racks to cool completely.
